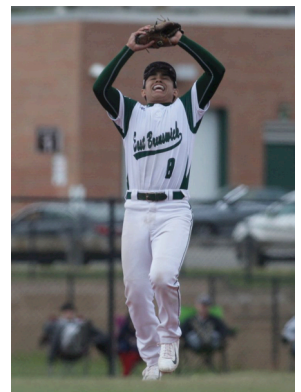

## COACH CHRIS KENNEY Career Record: 97-55 (6 seasons)



Chris enters his 7<sup>th</sup> season as the Varsity baseball coach at East Brunswick. Over the course of the last six years coach Kenney has rebuilt and turned the Bears into a well-respected program in the GMC. In the last six years the Bears have won the Red Division 3 times and the greater Middlesex county tournament. The 2016 season saw Coach Kenney set the Bears season record in wins with 21-3 record. As a result, in 2016 his fellow peers named Kenney coach of the year. Prior to East Brunswick, Chris served as the Assistant Varsity Coach at Christian Brothers Academy for 11 seasons. Chris was an assistant for his father Marty Kenney who is currently the second active all-time winningest coach in the state of NJ with 775 victories. During Chris's 11 years as an assistant he was a part of (10) division championships, (2) County Championships, (2) Shore Conference Tournament Championships and a 2009 Parochial A' State Championship. Chris also served as the head coach for the Bayshore Colts Senior American Legion team.

Chris was a former All-County and All-Shore player at Christian Brothers Academy. In 1994, he was selected to participate in the New Jersey State Senior All-Star Game. He was also a member of the 1994 Carpenter Cup Tournament championship team and was selected All-Division and All-County.

Chris received a scholarship to play at Monmouth University before transferring. Chris played at Mary Washington College in Fredericksburg, Virginia where he was twice selected to the Division III All-Region team and al the All-Virginia Collegiate team. In 2012 Chris was chosen by Mary Washington College as one of their 25 best players over the past 25 years, being selected for their Silver Anniversary Team.

Chris is a Special Education Teacher at East Brunswick Twp. High School.

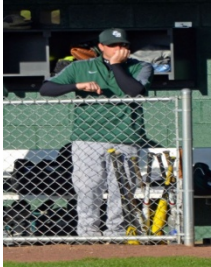


# ASSISTANT BASEBALL COACHES

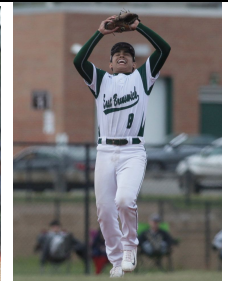
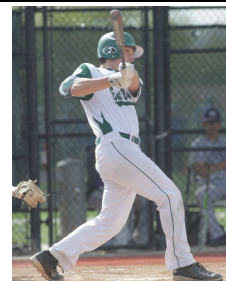
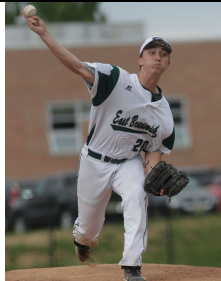
Coach Fisher is also in his 4<sup>th</sup> year working in the East Brunswick Public Schools.

## Bears confident in pitching depth behind Burnham

March 28, 2017

There's always been an emphasis on pitching depth in high school baseball, and a rule change that goes into effect this spring makes it more important than ever. For that reason, it remains to be seen if East Brunswick High School can duplicate what it did in 2016, even with the return of Tyler Burnham, who is arguably the top hurler in the Greater Middlesex Conference (GMC) and is joined by a core that has played together



for multiple seasons. The Bears come off one of their best seasons in program history, finishing 21-3 and capturing the GMC Tournament and Red Division championships. Burnham, who committed to Seton Hall University, will

again be East Brunswick's No. 1 hurler. The senior was a major reason for the Bears' banner 2016 with a 9-1 win-loss record with 66 strikeouts in 66 innings, and he was personally responsible for the Bears' GMC Tournament title when he pitched a shutout and singled in the only run in their victory over John. P. Stevens High School.

However, East Brunswick cannot expect to be a division contender and repeat what it did in the postseason if Burnham is the only effective pitcher. Head coach Chris Kenney is confident junior Mike Falco (2-0), who threw important innings, will be a reliable No. 2. He is joined by seniors Evan Dekhayser and Ryan Flynn; junior newcomers James Schuld, Scott Dessel, Kevin Shulster and Brad Edwards; and sophomore Joe





Petrocelli. If pitching falters, the hope is the firepower in the lineup will take up the slack. "We return three of last season's top hitters (Burnham, .386; Flynn, .338; and junior David Bermudez, .341) and three more who saw significant time (seniors Matt Bartus, .273; Christian Shelley, .250; and Jay Marchese)," Kenney said. Burnham plays first when he doesn't pitch, Flynn is in center field and Bermudez starts at shortstop.



Kenney said the lineup should be fortified by players from last year's junior varsity team, which won the conference sub-varsity tournament, including Falco (third base), Schuld (second base), Brad Edwards (catcher/outfield) and Brandon Rosenthal (outfield). Seniors Nick Martino (left field), David Paribello (outfield), Marchese (catcher) and Matt Nelson (second base) will also be

likely starters.

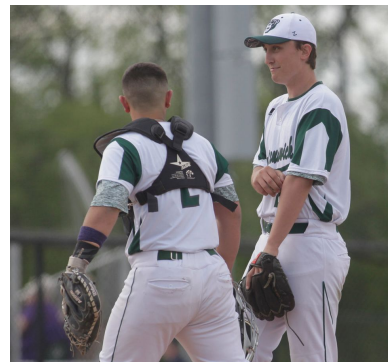
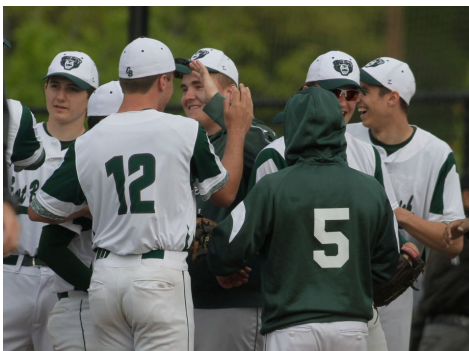
"With the new pitching rule, we need to have at least four capable arms, and I'm confident our pitching staff can deliver that," Kenney said. "Our goal every year is to win the Red Division and the GMC Tournament, and I believe we have a good chance at repeating. We have some holes to fill with the graduation of some great players (Daniel Ianarrone, Nick Clemente, Gerard Pepe, Chris Cap and Juan Ganzaroli), but we expect the new guys to come through." East Brunswick opens the season April 1 at Saint Joseph High School of Metuchen and hosts the Falcons two days later. On April 8, the Bears are home to Hillsborough High School.

**East Brunswick ace Tyler Burnham** wanted **South Brunswick**

to see him sweat on Monday. "I've been watching the weather for a week," said Burnham, a senior left-hander. "I've pitched in some rough weather. This was only the second time I was able to get a good sweat going and get real loose." With perspiration came the missing feel for the breaking pitch and change-up. With feel came command, with command came strikeouts, with strikeouts came confidence. It amounted to a masterful performance. Burnham threw the first no-hitter of his varsity career and East Brunswick moved to the top of the Greater Middlesex Conference Red Division with a 4-0 victory over South Brunswick. East Brunswick (11-4) has won four of its last five games. South Brunswick was one-hit by Allentown's Jordan Winston on April 20. Winston took a no-hitter to the seventh inning. "I've been waiting all season for this Tyler Burnham," said East Brunswick head coach Chris Kenney. "I think he's been trying to throw too hard all spring and got himself out of whack. He's been throwing in a lot of games, but today he pitched." And he dominated. Burnham (4-0) threw 93 pitches and struck out 10. He walked two. One South Brunswick hitter reached on an error. Burnham now has an impressive, season-long, strikeout-to-walk ratio of 44-12. "I just felt good all day," Burnham said. "I was able to throw all three pitches for strikes in any count. I pounded their hitters on the inside corner with the fastball." "They didn't hit a ball well all day," Kenney said. "There were no diving plays or anything like that. Some routine ground balls and a couple in the air." It was a day when the pieces came together for East Brunswick. The Bears banged out 13 hits. **Brad Edwards, Ryan**





Flynn, Brandon Rosenthal and Burnham had two hits apiece. Burnham helped his own cause with a double and Rosenthal and a two-run triple. "I haven't been swinging the bat well, but to day I saw it well," Burnham said. The victory puts East Brunswick atop the Red Division with St. Joseph (Met.). Both teams have two divisional losses. "I knew I had to rise to the occasion," Burnham said. "This was a huge game for us in the state rankings and in our league. I knew I had to go out and do my job." It was a job well done.
